Learning Goals, Outcomes and Assessment for Trial Advocacy:

Learning Goals: The goal for this course is for students to learn the basic legal rules applicable to being a successful courtroom litigator. Students will also be exposed (where circumstances permit) to interactive exercises in all aspects of the trial of a criminal and civil case.

Learning Outcomes: Students will be able to conduct a successful voir dire, present an opening statement and closing argument, understand and conduct a thorough direct examination, cross-examination and be able to qualify an expert witness. Students will also gain an enhanced learning of the Rules of Evidence based on the text and intent behind the rules.

Assessment: Class attendance and participation (by virtue of either cold calling or volunteering) will also be taken into account in calculating a student's ability to successfully pass this course. As this class is very interactive, students will be expected to have prepared for class exercises and the role-playing exercises necessary to become effective courtroom advocates.
