# Seminar overview

*Description.* The goal of the seminar is to help you learn to identify critical antitrust issues related to mergers and acquisitions. We will discuss substantive and procedural issues that have arisen in recent merger cases, as well as recent agency policy developments. Our discussions will be supplemented by visits from guest experts throughout the semester.

*Learning Outcomes.* This seminar is intended to help you (1) understand the process and substance of contemporary antitrust merger law, policy, and enforcement; (2) identify important issues that may arise during an agency merger investigation and enforcement action; (3) understand the factors that influence an agency's decision to challenge a merger, and (4) understand key issues that bear on a court's determination of the legality of a merger. The seminar is intended to help prepare you for practice with an agency, law firm, or in-house legal team.

Prerequisites. Law 156 Antitrust I: Principles.

*Text and reading materials.* There is no assigned text. Reading materials and assignments are listed below. The syllabus will be updated during the semester to reflect developing issues of interest or for other reasons.

Availability. I am happy to answer questions via email, generally within 24 hours. I also usually will be available after class.

# Course requirements and grading

*Grades.* Grades will be based on (i) a 30-minute seminar presentation regarding a merger or merger issue of your choice (15%), (ii) participation in seminar discussions (15%), and (iii) a final paper (70%). The presentation will be graded pass/fail. Participation will be based on your contribution to our in-class discussions, especially your engagement with guest experts.

*Presentation.* You must clear your topic with me a week before your presentation. You should expect to talk for 15-20 minutes and engage with your seminar colleagues for 10-15 minutes.

*Participation.* As this is a seminar course, you are expected to come to class prepared to discuss required readings.

*Paper*. Your final papers should be at least 20 pages (double spaced, 12-point font), and relate to merger or acquisitions. You must submit to me a one-paragraph description of a proposed paper for approval by September 29, and a three-page outline of your paper by October 20. The final paper is due on November 22. I encourage you to begin outlining and drafting your paper as soon as possible.
