## **Learning Goals, Outcomes and Assessment for Trial Advocacy:**

<u>Learning Goals</u>: The goal for this course is for students to learn the basic legal rules applicable to being a successful courtroom litigator. Students will also be exposed (where circumstances permit) to interactive exercises in all aspects of the trial of a criminal and civil case.

<u>Learning Outcomes</u>: Students will be able to conduct a successful voir dire, present an opening statement and closing argument, understand and conduct a thorough direct examination, cross-examination, and be able to qualify an expert witness. Students will also gain an enhanced understanding of the Rules of Evidence based on the text and intent behind the rules.

<u>Assessment:</u> Class attendance and participation (by virtue of either cold calling or volunteering) will also be taken into account in calculating a student's ability to successfully pass this course. As this class is very interactive, students will be expected to have prepared for class exercises and the role-playing exercises necessary to become effective courtroom advocates.
