Student Learning Objectives:

- 1. Students will become familiar with both classic and modern arguments for an administrative state of permanent government employees who are largely insulated from political control.
- 2. Students will become familiar with arguments based on economics against central planning by the administrative state.
- 3. Students will be exposed to the main legal and constitutional arguments again the administrative state.
- 4. Students will reach their own conclusions about the pluses and minuses of the administrative state.

Grades will be based primarily on a written essay exam. However, class participation will also be considered, and may count for up to one-third of a student's grades. Because class discussions are an integral part of the course, students are permitted to miss no more than three classes during the term.
